Parking is at Droke Forest Car Park on the minor road between Upwaltham and East Dean (the West Sussex one!) and is free. Some of the route near East Dean is quite wet so hiking boots rather than hiking shoes probably the better option.

Final call

Our foreign trip for 2024 takes us to the beautiful island of Madeira. Surging from the Atlantic Ocean, Madeira offers a temperate sub-tropical paradise perfect for year-round walking. One of Madeira's many charms is its infinite variety; each day's walking and every levada - the island's unique network of water channels - is different. Landscapes vary from cultivated vine terraces and verdant slopes dotted with white hamlets to coastal cliffs with balcony views over the azure seas. Some walks may require "a head for heights" as levada can be deep and walks along the edges occur.

We will purchase this self-guided walking holiday from Headwater Travel (The Company Exodus use for these holidays). A representative from Headwater is located on the Island should we need help.

The Itinerary and details of the holiday can be found at Itinerary for Madeira.

We will take the half board option as the nearest village is 10Km away and we are staying in a remote village.

You will need to ensure that you have holiday insurance in place at the time of booking. If you are over the age of 80 you cannot drive in Madeira.

COSTS

Holiday: £979pp + £244pp (half board supplement). This is based on 2 people sharing a twin room. (Single room supplement is £304pp).

Flights: Booked separately from EasyJet. Please check EasyJet Web site for prices.

In addition, you will need to budget for insurance, fuel, packed lunches, and drinks. Please ensure that your insurance cover is for a Walking Holiday abroad and includes re-patriation. Holiday insurance needs to be in place when you book the holiday. You are liable to pay the full amount of the holiday once you book unless a substitute can take your place.

Weekend Trip

We're trying again to make this trip happen!

This time the accommodation will only be confirmed when we have the numbers so please reserve your place as early as possible so we can secure a booking.

For this three night trip we'll stay in Ledbury, six miles from the Malvern Hills, in one or more lovely lodges (with no bunk beds!), depending on numbers.

Each lodge has one double room. Cost is estimated for single occupancy but could reduce if we achieve any doubling up.)

There will be two full day walks (Saturday and Sunday) in and around the Malvern Hills and a shorter one in the Cotswolds on the Monday after an early departure from the accommodation.

Each lodge has an open plan lounge/kitchen/dining area with a leather suite and wood-burning stove. Additional heating is provided by storage heaters.

The main bathrooms have bath, shower cubicle with electric shower, sink, wc and electric shaver point.

The double bedrooms have ensuite shower rooms, with electric shower, a sink, wc and electric shaver point.

With 5 or 6 people in each lodge, we will share these bathroom facilities during the daytime.

There are also furnished patios and a sauna room!

Bedding is provided but not towels.

We will arrange the usual merry meals rota, possibly alternating between the lodges for cooking and washing up but probably serving up in both dining areas (or on the patios if the weather is kind!)

Accomodation:

Woodside Country Park is a family run 28-acre park set in countryside with stunning views, an abundance of wildlife plus fishing and wild swimming available only to those staying on site.

Care has been taken to preserve and enhance the surrounding environment, by providing wild flower and natural woodland areas, thus encouraging an abundance of wild life. This has been recognised by the number of awards received over the years, including the David Bellamy Gold Awards for conservation every year since 2005!

Nestling amongst the scenic woodland slopes at the foot of the Malvern Hills, is the nearby historic Market town of Ledbury, first noted in the Doomsday Book as Ledberge, an ancient settlement since the Stone Age and famous for its black and white buildings.

The countryside surrounding Ledbury is noted for its Hop Yards, Cider Orchards (including the

traditional cider and perry products), and the world famous Hereford Cattle

Boscastle is a village on the north coast of Cornwall perfectly situated for coastal walks along the south west coast path and on Bodmin moor.

We will have three full days of walking, two of which will be point to point utilising public transport (or if needed some clever car manoeuvring) to walk back to Boscastle along the coastal path and one of which will be exploring Bodmin moor going up Cornwall's highest peak Brown Willy as well as the slightly lower Rough Tor. The coastal days will have some significant ascents and descents.

For those who would prefer shorter walks or just less up and down there are some great options including a walk along the coastal path to Tintagel castle and then on to St Nectans Glen. Walks in and around Port Isaac a beautiful fishing village used as a set location for several shows including Poldark and Doc Martin. Boscastle is home to the Museum of Witchcraft and Magic which holds one of the largest collections in the world of it's kind, and provides another option for those who would prefer not to do a longer walk

At current I have two cottages reserved on Cargurra Park Farm which will sleep 12, with 6 in each cottage. If there are more than 12 people wanting to join the trip there is potential to change the booking to the YHA in Boscastle once this opens - depending of course on the cost. The cottages are side by side. Having spoken to the owners it may not be possible for us all to comfortably sit around one table to enjoy our merry meals together however there is outside seating that we would all fit around should the weather allow.

The estimated cost for the trip, based on 8 people is £215 for group travel and £175 for independents. Based on 12 people it would be £165 for group travel and £125 for independents.

Week and Weekend Trip

We will be staying approx. 20 minutes drive away from Dufton at Greengill Bunk Barn, in the pretty village of Morland in the Eden valley. It's quite a luxurious bunk barn with a large central recreation room with comfy sofas, armchairs, pool table, table tennis and darts. It sleeps 16 in two bunk rooms of 8. There's a fully equipped kitchen, 3 showers and 3 toilets, and free unlimited WiFi. Only 4 parking spaces though!

I would propose that we eat at the local village pub on the first night, self-cater for two nights and on the final night eat at the Stag at Dufton. This gives a full day for travelling up and back - though of course we could always find a short local walk if that's what you want! The walks would be 3 full day walks, with shorter options for those not so keen on the longer options.

My ideal programme for the three days would be:

Day 1. High Cup Nick circuit (or out and back for the shorter route, the participants can decide when to turn back once they've had a glimpse of the Nick itself). This would be around 10 miles and 1800ft of ascent starting from the hostel front door and takes in the marvellous geological wonder of the Nick.

Day 2. Knock Old Man and Great Dun Fell; again from the hostel door.11.5 miles and 2600 ft of ascent. The shorter option today could be Knock Old Man with a circuit (or ascent) of Dufton Pike on the return.

Day 3 would be an ascent of Cross Fell, the highest point on the Pennine Way and the only hill in England to have its own named wind, the Helm Wind. The aim would be to go to Greg's Hut for a sheltered lunch in the bothy, then summit and return the same way - but with magnificent (hopefully) views of the Lake District northern fells as we descend. This would be around 10 miles and 2600 ft of ascent again, and requires careful planning as parking at the start is limited. The shorter option could be any of several local walks, or indeed a day on the Carlisle to Settle railway which runs through Appleby. The Howgill Fells are close by, as are some sections of Wainwright's C2C route, so there are lots of possibilities.

Please note the change of dates from the original YHA option.

The estimated cost, based on an occupancy of 10 would be around £205 for group travel and £140 for independents, with an £100 deposit per person. Obviously this will go down if we have more than 10 participants.

It's time to dust off your camping kit!*

"Corfe Castle has been a Saxon stronghold, a Norman fortress, a royal palace and a family home in ten centuries of dominating the Purbeck landscape. In that time it has seen murder and war, known kings and paupers and its rugged beauty has won the hearts of thousands of visitors."

We are heading to Woodyhyde campsite, situated in the heart of the gorgeous Purbeck countryside, just a 20 minute walk to the stunning ruins of Corfe Castle and a short distance from the seaside town of Swanage.

I have booked the campsite for 10 people (but should be able to add more). Woodhyde does not allocate designated pitches, but allows us to pitch wherever we prefer (when Steve and I arrive we will find a suitable spot for all of us, so that we can all pitch close by each other).

We will eat out in Corfe both nights - unless the weather forecast looks so amazing and we decide to do a BBQ one night (the campsite shop stocks everything we would need such that this a decision we can make on the day).

You will however need to plan and bring your own breakfasts and pack lunches. There is a well-stocked shop onsite which conveniently offers a very reasonable icepack-freezing service.

As to the walking (which I why we are going after all!) on the first day we will walk from the campsite up onto the Purbeck Hills and out to Old Harry's Rocks, from which we look across to the Needles on the isle of Wight. From there we head round to Swanage where we will take the steam train back to the campsite.

On the second day we will walk from the campsite out to join the coastal path on the outstanding Jurassic Coast, passing the abandoned stone quarry at Winspit and Dancing Ledges, before heading back to our cars in the late afternoon / early evening, in time for people to make their way home to Sussex (a 2 hour drive, depending on traffic) stopping in Wareham for a fish & chip supper en route.

*If you don't have a tent / airbed / cooking equipment but would still like to camp please do get in touch as we will be able to arrange for you to borrow kit or share with someone else.

If you love camping but aren't keen on canvas, the site offers a very glamorous glamping option, in a shepherd hut or a yurt. It is undeniably more expensive, but may be what you need to enable you to join us on this trip. Please email me if this interests you.
